### **The Collect for the Second Sunday after Pentecost**

*Celebrant* Grant, O Lord, that the course of this world may be so peaceably ordered by your providence, that your Church may joyfully serve you in quiet confidence and godly peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. ***Amen.***

**The First Lesson is from the Book of the Prophet Hosea, chapter 5, beginning to read at verse 15.**

<sup>15</sup> I will return again to my place, until they acknowledge their guilt and seek my face, and in their distress earnestly seek me. <sup>6</sup> “Come, let us return to the Lord; for he has torn us, that he may heal us; he has struck us down, and he will bind us up. <sup>2</sup> After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will raise us up, that we may live before him. <sup>3</sup> Let us know; let us press on to know the Lord; his going out is sure as the dawn; he will come to us as the showers, as the spring rains that water the earth.” <sup>4</sup> What shall I do with you, O Ephraim? What shall I do with you, O Judah? Your love is like a morning cloud, like the dew that goes early away. <sup>5</sup> Therefore I have hewn them by the prophets; I have slain them by the words of my mouth, and my judgment goes forth as the light. <sup>6</sup> For I desire steadfast love and not sacrifice, the knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings. (ESV)

**Psalm 50** *Let us read this Psalm responsively by half verse.*

- 1 The LORD, even the most mighty God, has spoken \*  
*and called the world, from the rising of the sun to the  
going down thereof.*
- 2 Out of Zion, perfect in her beauty, \*  
*has God shone forth in glory.*
- 3 Our God shall come and shall not keep silence; \*  
*there shall go before him a consuming fire, and a mighty  
tempest shall be stirred up round about him.*
- 4 He shall call to the heavens above, \*  
*and to the earth beneath, that he may judge his people:*
- 5 “Gather my faithful together unto me, \*  
*those who have made a covenant with me by sacrifice.”*
- 6 And the heavens shall declare his righteousness, \*  
*for God himself is Judge.*
- 7 “Hear, O my people, and I will speak; \*  
*I myself will testify against you, O Israel, for I am God,  
even your God.*
- 8 I will not rebuke you because of your sacrifices, or for your burnt offerings, \*  
*because they are always before me.*
- 9 I will take no bull calf out of your house, \*  
*nor he-goat out of your folds.*
- 10 For all the beasts of the forest are mine, \*  
*and so are the cattle upon a thousand hills.*
- 11 I know all the birds of the air, \*  
*and the wild beasts of the field are in my sight.*
- 12 If I were hungry, I would not tell you, \*  
*for the whole world is mine, and all that is therein.*
- 13 Do you think that I will eat the flesh of bulls \*  
*and drink the blood of goats?*
- 14 Offer unto God a sacrifice of thanksgiving, \*  
*and pay your vows unto the Most High,*

- 15 And call upon me in the time of trouble; \*  
*so will I hear you, and you shall praise me.*
- 16 But to the ungodly God says: \*  
*“Why do you recite my laws, and take my covenant in  
your mouth,*
- 17 Though you hate to be disciplined, \*  
*and have cast my words behind you?*
- 18 When you saw a thief, you agreed with him, \*  
*and you have taken part with adulterers.*
- 19 You have let your mouth speak wickedness, \*  
*and with your tongue you have set forth deceit.*
- 20 You sat and spoke against your brother; \*  
*yes, and have slandered your own mother’s son.*
- 21 These things you have done, and I held my tongue, \*  
*and you thought wickedly that I am such a one as  
yourself.*
- 22 But I will reprove you, \*  
*and set before you the things that you have done.*
- 23 O consider this, you who forget God, \*  
*lest I tear you in pieces, and there be none to deliver  
you.*
- 24 Whoever offers me a sacrifice of thanksgiving honors me, \*  
*and to him who orders his way aright will I show  
the salvation of God.”*

**The second lesson is from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans, chapter 4, beginning to read at verse 13.**

<sup>13</sup>For the promise to Abraham and his offspring that he would be heir of the world did not come through the law but through the righteousness of faith. <sup>14</sup>For if it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void.

<sup>15</sup>For the law brings wrath, but where there is no law there is no transgression. <sup>16</sup>That is why it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his offspring—not only to the adherent of the law but also to the one

who shares the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all, <sup>17</sup> as it is written, “I have made you the father of many nations”—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. <sup>18</sup> In hope he believed against hope, that he should become the father of many nations, as he had been told, “So shall your offspring be.” (ESV)

**The Nicene Creed**

***Celebrant***    Let us confess our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed:

***All***            ***We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible.***

*We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us and for our salvation He came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate; He suffered death and was buried. On the third day He rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and His kingdom will have no end.*

*We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.*

### **Prayers of the People**

*Celebrant* Almighty God, Your Son Jesus Christ has promised that You will hear us when we ask in faith: Lord, receive the prayers we offer to You.

*Psalmist*            For the nations of the world that they may peacefully co-exist, and that a spirit of respect and forbearance may grow among nations and peoples. Strengthen and protect those serving and defending our nation at home and abroad.

*All*                    ***Bind them together, O Lord.***

*Psalmist*            We pray for the persecuted church that the believers will sense God's presence; that they feel connected to the greater Body of Christ; and that they will be comforted by God if their family members are killed, injured or imprisoned for their witness.

*All*                    ***Lord, in Your mercy, hear our prayer.***

*Psalmist*            Strengthen your Church for her witness and work in the world. Today we lift-up Grace Community Anglican Church in Katy, TX. We ask your anointing upon the Fellowship of Confessing Anglicans around the world. We especially pray that you would use our sister parish, Christ Church Jerusalem, as an instrument for your peace in Jerusalem, Israel, and the Middle East.

*All*                    ***Strengthen Your people, O Lord.***

*Psalmist*            For the little children and babies: born and unborn, that their tender lives may be protected and their rights guarded.

*All*                    ***Protect them, O Lord.***

*Psalmist*            We praise You and thank You for Your bountiful blessings. We know it is You who continues to provide for the growth of this City on a Hill. We pray for the continual support and commitment of this parish family who call this their church home.

*All*                    ***Lord, hear our prayers.***

*Celebrant*           Grant these our prayers, O Father, for Jesus Christ's sake, our only Mediator and Advocate. ***Amen.***

## Prayers of Penitence

*Celebrant* Hear the words of challenge and comfort our Savior Christ says to all who follow him. If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself, take up his cross and follow Me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for My sake will save it. *(Luke 9:23-24)*

*Celebrant* Almighty God, whose steadfast love is as great as the heavens are high above the earth, remove your sins from you as far as the east is from the west, strengthen your life in His kingdom and keep you upright to the last day; through Jesus Christ our merciful High Priest. ***Amen.***

*All* ***Thank you Father, for forgiveness; we come to Your table as Your children, not presuming but assured, not trusting ourselves but Your Word; we hunger and thirst for righteousness, and ask for our hearts to be satisfied with the body and blood of Your Son, Jesus Christ the righteous. Amen.***

*Celebrant* Almighty God, owner of all things, we thank You for giving up Your Son to die on the cross for us who owe You everything. Pour Your refreshing Spirit on us as we remember Him in the way He commanded, through these gifts of Your creation.

On the same night that He was betrayed He took bread and gave You thanks; He broke it and gave it to His disciples, saying, ‘Take, eat, this is My body which is given for You; Do this in remembrance of Me’.

*People* ***Amen. His body was broken for us.***

*Celebrant* In the same way, after supper He took the cup and gave You thanks; He gave it to them saying: ‘Drink this, all of you, this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me’.

He died in our place, making a full atonement for the sins of the whole world, the perfect sacrifice, once and for all. You accepted His offering by raising Him from death, and granting Him great honor at Your right hand on high.
